Aldrich Rockefeller Folk Art Museum and DeWitt Wallace Decorative Arts Museum. The institution also maintains a collection of some 5,000 architectural artifacts. Most are associated with the nearly ninety 18th and early 19th-century structures that survive in Williamsburg's Historic Area. These materials, periodically exhibited to the public, inform our restoration and preservation decisions. Finally, Colonial Williamsburg holds approximately sixty million archaeological artifacts, most excavated in or near the Historic Area. These materials are widely studied by scholars in the United States and abroad. The artifacts are periodically featured in exhibits.

The Foundation's endowment consists of 260 individual funds restricted for a variety of purposes. The endowment includes both donor-restricted endowment funds and funds designated by the Board of Trustees to function as endowments. In accordance with the Foundation's Investment Policy, the Foundation appropriates for distribution each year six percent of its endowment fund's average fair market value over the prior 12 quarters through the June 30 preceding the calendar year in which the distribution is planned. The annual withdrawal includes amounts for operations and capital expenditures and amounts utilized in accordance with the terms of donor-restricted and board-designated endowments. The board approved supplemental withdrawals include amounts for debt repayment and interest expense. Withdrawals from the unrestricted portion of the endowment fund may by made with the approval of the Foundation's Board of Trustees.

#### Statement of Program Service Accomplishments

MISSION

The Colonial Williamsburg Foundation is a nonprofit, tax-exempt organization established in 1928 to preserve and restore 18th-century Williamsburg, which served as Virginia's colonial capital from 1699 to 1780. A Board of Trustees governs the Foundation, which is organized and operated exclusively for charitable and educational purposes. Guided by its mission "that the future may learn from the past," it preserves, restores, reconstructs, or otherwise maintains historical resources

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for the purposes of enabling related interpretive, research, or educational activities. Through this work, the Foundation engages, informs, and inspires people around the world, both onsite and online, as they learn about this historic city, the events that occurred here, and the diverse peoples who helped shape our nation.

The Foundation's activities include historical and archaeological research; preservation of artifacts and buildings; interpretation of exhibition buildings and historic trades; re-creation of historic events; publication of scholarly and popular works; conservation and exhibition of art and antiques; and educational outreach through teacher training, distance-learning programs and websites, and curriculum development.

Support for Colonial Williamsburg's operations comes from such sources as donations, ticketed admission, sales of trade products and licensed reproductions, taverns and restaurants, publications, property rentals, and hospitality and convention services. In accordance with board policies, support is provided annually from the Foundation's endowment for educational and museum programs, as well as Historic Area preservation and restoration. In 2021, more than 94,400 donors made gifts and grants to the Foundation.

In 2020 at the start of the COVID-19 pandemic, The Colonial Williamsburg Foundation shifted its resources to build a strong online presence that continues today. Live-stream and recorded programming provide entertaining and educational content for hundreds of thousands of online viewers. The number of social media views, a metric to measure the impact of expanding online programming, jumped from 1.1 million in 2019 to more than 15.7 million at the end of 2021, significantly

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expanding the Foundation's reach as an educational resource far beyond its geographic footprint. The Foundation is grateful to have received an increase in donor gifts to offset the cost of digital operations during the pandemic.

#### EDUCATION, RESEARCH AND HISTORICAL INTEPRETATION

Colonial Williamsburg's Historic Area encompasses 301 acres of greens and gardens and more than 600 structures - 88 of them original - that range from the formal splendor of the Governor's Palace to the utilitarian kitchen garden of the James Geddy site. The Historic Area is protected from modern intrusions by a 2,800-acre greenbelt, and Colonial Williamsburg is accredited as a Level II Arboretum by ArbNet, a global arboretum accreditation program.

Historic trades interpretation, dramatic vignettes, interactive programs and encounters with people including Colonial Williamsburg's Nation Builders - real historic figures associated with the 18th-century city who made significant contributions to the American story - take place throughout the Historic Area, offering an engaging, entertaining guest experience that educates and captures the relevance of early American history in today's world. Homes, public buildings and shops are furnished with objects from Colonial Williamsburg's extensive collection of English and American antiques and reproductions made by skilled artisans employed by the Foundation.

Important work continues among historians and interpreters to portray an accurate representation of 18th-century life in Williamsburg where 52 percent of the population was African American, and most were enslaved. Telling the story of the Black experience continues a more than 40-year commitment from the Foundation to tell the stories of the lives of men and women, enslaved and free, who helped secure America's freedom.

Newly uncovered history — whether through excavations at the original site of the First Baptist Church, Williamsburg Bray School and careful research within the archives of the John D. Rockefeller, Jr. Library — makes its way into the Foundation's educational programming. Historical integrity is critical to Colonial Williamsburg's credibility and worldwide reputation. The library is open to the public for research; however, use of Corporate Archives, Special Collections and Visual Resources requires an advance appointment. The library maintains a reference section and houses more than 104,000 items (books, CDs, and videos); more than 12,000 rare books; approximately 50,000 manuscript items; 10,000 reels of microfilm; more than 50,000 architectural drawings; more than 500,000 photos in various formats; and provides access to many databases relating to the study of colonial British America, the American Revolution, and the early United States. The library maintains opportunities for historical research through Fellowship opportunities.

Colonial Williamsburg renewed its commitment to independent scholarly research in 2021 by joining William & Mary to financially support the Omohundro Institute of Early American History & Culture. The Omohundro Institute (OI) was established by the two institutions in 1943 and has grown into the nation's leading academic center of historical research on all aspects of early America. The reunion of the three entities re-establishes financial support and in-kind benefits provided by The Colonial Williamsburg Foundation and positions the three institutions at the center of historical scholarship as the country approaches its 250th anniversary in 2026.

The Bob and Marion Wilson Teacher Institute of Colonial Williamsburg expanded its online professional development and reached more teachers across the country in

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2021. Using the online format, 55% of the teachers who participated were new to the Teacher Institute and educational opportunities offered by the Foundation. By taking the institute online, Colonial Williamsburg supported 1474 teachers from more than 41 states.

The Teacher Institute presented three online professional development opportunities, new monthly chat opportunities during the 2021-2022 school year, and supported student online programming. In addition, teachers and students accessed content live on Facebook as well as via the Colonial Williamsburg YouTube channel, Amazon Fire and Roku. In the fall, more than 50 William & Mary students participated in onsite programming in the Historic Area for their teaching method courses.

The Teacher Institute presents an immersive and inclusive approach to teaching American history and civics content through online and on-site programming and the distribution of media to general public and K-16 education audiences. The Colonial Williamsburg Education Resource Library provides interactive history lessons to elementary, middle, and high school classrooms nationally and internationally. This free online media library supports planning and classroom instruction through age-appropriate cross-curricular materials, activities, and lessons. The Education Resource Library has more than 200 resources covering American history from 1607 through the Civil War.

#### **TAVERNS AND COLONIAL HOUSES**

Colonial Williamsburg's taverns and colonial houses operate in the Historic Area providing visitors with an interactive experience unique to the 18th century. Ideal for guests who wish to fully immerse themselves in the 18th century, Colonial Williamsburg offers authentic period accommodations in the Historic Area where our founding families once lodged. The Colonial Houses offer accommodations in colonial

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style at 28 guest houses, some as small as one room within a tavern and others as large as 16 rooms. Furnished with authentic period reproductions and antiques, each Colonial House has a unique history and appeal of its own, offering a rare way to experience the restored 18th-century capital of Virginia. Servers in the taverns are in period dress and interpret the 18th-century dining experience.

#### **MUSEUMS, PRESERVATION AND HISTORIC RESOURCES**

The Colonial Williamsburg Foundation operates two world-class Art Museums showcasing collections to enhance and enrich the guest experience beyond the living history of the Historic Area. The award-winning DeWitt Wallace Decorative Arts Museum houses the Foundation's renowned collection of British and American fine and decorative arts dating from 1600 through 1840. The award-winning Abby Aldrich Rockefeller Folk Art Museum is the oldest institution in the United States dedicated solely to the collection and preservation of American folk art.

Colonial Williamsburg also operates Bassett Hall, a two-story, 18th-century frame house which is situated near the near the colonial Capitol. The house was the Williamsburg home of Mr. and Mrs. John D. Rockefeller Jr., and retains the original furnishings used by them from 1936-1948.

Colonial Williamsburg's wide-ranging collections, acquired over the past 90 years, provide the art, objects, artifacts, and buildings necessary to accurately recreate the environment of 18th-century Williamsburg. The archaeological and architectural collection include 500,000 whole archaeological artifacts from excavations in and around Williamsburg as well as 60 million fragments (probably the largest single archaeological holding relating to 18th-century America), and some 19,000 architectural fragments. The collections of British and American art and antiques include 77,000 objects, among them ceramics and glass, costumes, household

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accessories, furniture, musical instruments, numismatics, games and toys, kitchen equipment, paintings and drawings, prints and maps, scientific equipment, silver and base metals, textiles, tools and machines, and weapons. The Foundation's holdings in southern furniture, American folk art, English silver and pewter, English porcelain, numismatics, tools, and several other categories are considered the most comprehensive in the nation.

The Foundation's extensive collections are researched by curators, archaeologists, and architectural historians and cared for by a staff of conservators and historic preservation professionals, all of whom oversee their display and care in the Historic Area and at the Art Museums. The Foundation is widely recognized for its expertise in colonial Virginia history and professionalism of its staff. Drawing from a collection of more than 70,000 objects, Colonial Williamsburg furnishes, maintains, and interprets more than 200 18th-century period rooms and craft shops.

The Art Museums of Colonial Williamsburg's recent 65,000-square-foot expansion and renovation project added a new, highly visible and accessible main entrance, increased exhibition space by 25%, expanded museum café and retail spaces, and transformed the Hennage Auditorium into a state-of-the-art theater space. Striking landscape plantings of native, disease-resistant flowers, shrubs and trees accentuate the exterior of the enlarged facility.

The DeWitt Wallace Decorative Arts Museum features regularly changing thematic exhibitions drawn from Colonial Williamsburg's collections of British and American fine art and antiques. Highlights from its recent exhibitions include the following: English and American silver; British pottery and porcelain; paintings by Gilbert Stuart, Thomas Sully, John Wollaston, Charles Willson Peale, Godfrey

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Kneller, Peter Lely, and others; clothing and accessories from the late 17th through the mid-19th centuries; British and American needlework; weapons of the American Revolution; historic upholstery; coins and currency of early America; and examples of nearly every type of household furniture made and used in the American colonies.

The Abby Aldrich Rockefeller Folk Art Museum, the nation's leading center for research, preservation, and exhibition of American folk art, is adjacent to the DeWitt Wallace Museum. Through a series of regularly changing thematic exhibitions, Colonial Williamsburg displays its collection of nearly 7,000 examples of American folk art. This collection is designed to foster an appreciation for the aesthetic quality and educational value of American folk art and includes paintings, watercolors, pastels, calligraphic drawings, needlework, ceramics, musical instruments, three-dimensional carvings and sculptures, painted furniture, household ornaments, quilts, coverlets, and a wide array of other materials.

Together, the DeWitt Wallace Decorative Arts Museum and the Abby Aldrich Rockefeller Folk Art Museum opened three new exhibitions in 2021: A Gift to the Nation: The Joseph and June Hennage Collection, Art of the Quilter, and Navajo Weavings: Adapting Tradition. The Art Museums provide hundreds of school and family programs, lectures, tours, and musical and theatrical performances throughout the year in the galleries and Hennage Auditorium.

History continues to be rediscovered on the grounds of America's 18th-century capital city through the work of the Foundation's preservation and archaeological research programs.

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In early 2021, the Foundation, in partnership with William & Mary, announced the discovery of the Williamsburg Bray School, an 18th-century institution dedicated to the education of enslaved and free Black children. The two organizations are working together to ensure current and future generations learn about the complex history of what is likely the oldest extant building in the United States dedicated to the education of Black children - and the stories of those who were part of it. Plans are underway to preserve the building and move it from its present site on William & Mary's campus to Colonial Williamsburg's Historic Area at the northwest corner of the intersection of Francis and South Nassau streets. Once restored to its original state, the building will become the 89th original structure restored by the Foundation and will serve as a focal point for research, scholarship and dialogue regarding the complicated story of race, religion and education in Williamsburg and in America.

Ongoing work at Custis Square, the four-acre lot where John Custis IV built his home and garden, has potential to add significantly to our understanding of early American gardening, enslavement, colonial consumerism, and 18th-century scientific thought.

In September 2020, Colonial Williamsburg archaeologists began excavating the site of First Baptist Church, one of the nation's oldest Black churches that sat within the Foundation's Historic Area footprint. In addition to the original structure, in 2021, Colonial Williamsburg's archaeologists discovered upwards of 40 confirmed human burials at the site and are working with the descendant community to make decisions regarding the investigation of the burial sites. This multi-year project seeks the information needed to accurately reconstruct the earliest version of the church's first permanent structure, surrounding landscape and topography; to learn about the

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worship experiences of the church's early congregants.
